Course presentation	<p>The course in History of European Integration aims at providing students with a basic knowledge of the main stages that have marked the evolution of the institutional, political, economic and cultural process of building community dynamics. The course will be divided into lectures dedicated to the examination of some of the most significant aspects related to this process, such as: the contemporary origins of the idea of a united Europe; the pioneering phase of the European integration process; the ECSC and the EEC; the process of European integration in the 1960s and 1970s; the Single European Act; the Maastricht Treaty and the birth of the European Union; the Lisbon Treaty and the new European scenarios.</p>
