Course presentation	The course in Contemporary Crime History aims to provide students with a basic knowledge of the events of the contemporary world (19th and 20th century), with specific insights into some of the main theoretical paths followed by Italian criminology. The course will be divided into lectures dedicated to the examination of some of the most significant aspects relating to the period and themes indicated, including the development of Italian criminology, the imperialist and colonialist outlook, the two world wars, the birth of political movements in the 20th century, the Cold War and the East/West contrast, the history of republican Italy.
Prerequisites	There are no specific prerequisites for access to the course.
